Media Release

The Broome County Sheriff's Office arrested Matthew McCloe of Endicott yesterday who was wanted by the Broome County Sheriff's Office and the Pennsylvania State Police for charges stemming from a vehicle pursuit on August 31, 2022.

Members of the Patrol Division developed information on McCloe's whereabouts and initiated a surveillance detail consisting of a patrol sergeant and two deputies. McCloe is known to law enforcement and has a proclivity to non-compliance and evading the police. Yesterday afternoon McCloe was observed and positively identified exiting his vehicle. Members of the surveillance detail were able to surround him and take him into custody without incident and with minimal risk to public safety.

McCloe was found to possess several fictitious identification cards and a fictitious pistol permit. The license plate affixed to the rear of his vehicle was also fictitious. The vehicle was unregistered and uninsured. McCloe's vehicle was towed from the scene. McCloe was charged with the offenses listed below. He was taken to the Broome County Sheriff's Office Correctional Facility for arraignment at the Central Arraignment Part. The Pennsylvania State Police was notified that McCloe was in custody.
