At the request of the Administration, Mr. Wildoner made a motion, seconded by Mr. Bernhardsen to amend the second WHEREAS and first RESOLVED paragraphs of the Resolution to add the bold and underlined text as follows:

- The Senators shall pay the County a per game rental for preseason, regular season and playoff games of **\$1.00 per paid admission ticket**;
- Subject to availability the County shall provide at least <u>25</u> parking spaces during game and practice sessions <u>for use by volunteers only</u>; the Senators may sell additional parking, subject to availability and the revenue will be divided equally between the parties;

Answering a question from Mrs. Myers, Mr. Bernardo stated that previously the hockey team had paid the County \$2,000 per game and that this new deal will be more beneficial to the County. He further stated that there is an assignment clause in the contract, should another team relocate to Broome County, the current contract will be assigned to that team. Carried. Ayes-5, Nays-0
