RESOLUTION NO. 50

By County Administration, Economic Development, Education and Culture Committees Seconded by Mr. Pasquale

RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 1 OF 2018, ENTITLED: "A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 50 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE, ENERGIZE NY BENEFIT FINANCING PROGRAM"

WHEREAS, this County Legislature hereby finds and determines that Broome County enacted Local Law No. 5 of 2015 pursuant to provisions of New York General Municipal Law, to establish a Sustainable Energy Loan Program. This program authorized the Energy Improvement Corporation ("EIC"), a local development corporation acting on behalf of Broome County, to make funds available to qualified property owners for the installation of renewable energy systems and energy-efficiency measures, and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature further finds that the New York State Legislature recently amended certain provisions of the municipal sustainable energy loan program to "eliminate barriers that have been identified that have prevented the program from reaching its full potential", and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature finds that the amendments to the program, enacted as Chapter 320 of the 2017 Laws of the State of New York, seek to encourage net metered and community solar projects, will allow Broome County's program to use monies available from the State or any State authority, and will permit a more flexible loan standard for commercial properties, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the purpose of this law is to amend Broome County's Sustainable Energy Loan Program in conformity with changes recently enacted to the New York State enabling legislation, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Local Law Intro. No. 1 of 2018, entitled: "A Local Law Amending Chapter 50 of the Broome County Charter and Code, Energize NY Benefit Financing Program," be and the same hereby is adopted and approved in accordance with the Broome County Charter and Code and all the applicable statutes and laws pertaining thereto, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any municipal agreements with the EIC that are established under the authority of this Local Law and any amendments or modifications to those municipal agreements, must be enacted and approved by the Broome County Legislature through a Resolution.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 1 of 2018

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 50 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE, ENERGIZE NY BENEFIT FINANCING PROGRAM

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of Broome County, New York, as follows: <u>SECTION 1</u> Chapter 50 of the Broome County Charter and Code is amended as follows: § 50-1. Short title.

This chapter shall be known as the "Energize NY Benefit Financing Program," and shall read as follows:

§ 50-2. Legislative findings, intent and [;] purpose, authority.

- A. This chapter establishes a program that will allow the Energy Improvement Corporation ("EIC"), a local development corporation, acting on behalf of the County of Broome pursuant to the municipal agreement to be entered into between the County of Broome and EIC pursuant to Article 5-G of the New York General Municipal Law ("the Municipal Agreement"), to make funds available to qualified property owners that will be repaid by such property owners through charges on the real properties benefited by such funds, thereby fulfilling the purposes of this law and fulfilling an important public purpose. [This chapter establishes a program that will allow the Energy Improvement Corporation (EIC), a local development corporation, acting on behalf of Broome County, to make funds available to qualified property owners that will be repaid by such property owners through charges on the real properties benefited by such funds, thereby fulfilling the purposes of this section and fulfilling an important public purpose.]
- B Broome County is authorized to implement this Energize NY Benefit Financing Program pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law and Article 5-L of the New York General Municipal Law.
- C. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Energize NY Benefit Financing Program Law of Broome County."

§ 50-3. Definitions.

For purposes of this chapter and unless otherwise expressly stated or unless the context requires, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

AUTHORITY — The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, as defined by subdivision two of section 1851 of the Public Authorities Law, or its successor.

COUNTY — Broome County, State of New York

EIC — The Energy Improvement Corporation, a local development corporation, duly organized under section 1411 of the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law, authorized hereby on behalf of the County to implement the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program by providing funds to qualified property owners (as defined in this chapter) and providing for repayment of such funds from monies collected by the County Tax Collecting Officer [Collector] as a charge to be levied on the real property and collected in the same manner and same form as the County taxes.

ENERGY AUDIT — A formal evaluation or "assessment" of the energy consumption of a permanent building or structural improvement to real property, conducted by a contractor certified by the Authority, or certified by a certifying entity approved by the Authority, for the purpose of identifying appropriate energy efficiency improvements that could be made to the property.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENT — Any renovation or retrofitting of a building to reduce energy consumption, such as window and door replacement, lighting, caulking, weather stripping, air sealing, insulation, and heating and cooling system upgrades, and similar improvements, determined to be cost effective pursuant to criteria established by the Authority, not including lighting measures or household appliances that are not permanently fixed to real

property.

QUALIFIED PROPERTY OWNER — An owner of a residential or commercial <u>real</u> property located within the boundaries of the County that is determined to be eligible to participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program under the procedures for eligibility set forth under this chapter.

RENEWABLE ENERGY SYSTEM — An energy generating system for the generation of electric or thermal energy, to be used primarily as such property, except when the Qualified Property Owner is a commercial entity in which case the system may be used for other properties in addition to the subject property by means of solar thermal, solar photovoltaic, wind, geothermal, anaerobic digester gas-to-electricity systems, fuel cell technologies, or other renewable energy technology approved by the Authority not including the combustion or pyrolysis of solid waste.

RENEWABLE ENERGY SYSTEM FEASIBILITY STUDY — A written study, conducted by a contractor certified by the Authority, or certified by a certifying entity approved by the Authority, for the purpose of determining the feasibility of installing a renewable energy system.

§ 50-4. Establishment of an Energize NY Benefit Financing Program.

- A. An Energize NY Benefit Financing Program is hereby established by the County, whereby EIC acting on its behalf <u>pursuant to the Municipal Agreement [whereby EIC acting on its behalf pursuant to the Municipal Agreement]</u>, may provide funds to Qualified Property Owners in accordance with the procedures set forth under this Chapter, to finance the acquisition, construction and installation of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements and the verification of the installation of such systems and improvements.
- B. [The] For funds provided to a Qualified Property Owner which is a commercial entity, not-for-profit organization, or entity other that an individual, EIC shall have the authority to impose requirements on the maximum amount of funds to be provided, which may consider factors including but not limited to the property value, projected savings, project cost, and existing indebtedness secured by such property. [shall not exceed the lesser of 10% of the appraised value of the real property where the renewable energy systems and/or energy efficiency improvements will be located, or the actual cost of installing the renewable energy systems and/or energy efficiency improvements, including the costs of necessary equipment, materials, and labor and the cost of verification of such systems and improvements.]
- C. For Financings made to a Qualified Property Owner who is an individual, the funds provided shall not exceed the lesser of: (i) ten percent of the appraised value of the real property where the Renewable Energy Systems and/or Energy Efficiency Improvements will be located, or (ii) the actual cost of installing the Renewable Energy Systems and/or Energy Efficiency Improvements, including the costs of necessary equipment, materials, and labor and the cost of verification of such systems and improvements.
- § 50-5. Procedures for of eligibility.
- A. Any property owner in the County may submit an application to EIC on such forms as have been prepared by EIC and made available to property owners on the website of EIC and on the Broome County government website.
- B. Every application submitted by a property owner shall be reviewed by EIC acting on behalf of the County, which shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the criteria for making a financing enumerated in § 50-6 of this chapter. EIC may also request further information from the property owner where necessary to aid in its determination.
- C. If a positive determination on an application is made by EIC acting on behalf of the County, the property owner shall be deemed a Qualified Property Owner and shall be eligible to participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program in accordance with the procedure set forth under § 50-7 of this chapter; provided that in no case shall a property owner that has received funds from another municipal corporation for the acquisition, construction and

installation of energy efficiency improvements and/or renewable energy systems be deemed a Qualified Property Owner.

§ 50-6. Application criteria.

Upon the submission of an application, EIC acting on behalf of the County, shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the following criteria for the making of a financing:

- The proposed Energy Efficiency Improvements and/or Renewable Energy Systems are determined to be cost effective <u>based on guidelines issued</u> by the Authority;
- B. The property owner may not be in bankruptcy and the property may not constitute property subject to any pending bankruptcy proceeding; [The proposed energy efficiency improvements and/or renewable energy systems will generate an estimated annual cost savings greater than the annual charge payments;]
- C. The amount financed under the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program shall be repaid over a term not to exceed the weighted average of the useful life of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements to be installed on the property as determined by EIC;
- **D. [C]**. Sufficient funds are available **from EIC** to provide **financing** to the property owner;
- **E** [D]. The property owner is current in payments on any existing mortgage;
- **F** [E]. The property owner is current in payments on any existing real property taxes and has been current on real property taxes for the previous three years; and
- **G** [F]. Such additional criteria, not inconsistent with the criteria set forth above, as the County, or EIC acting on its behalf, may set from time to time
- § 50-7. Opt-in, Energize NY Finance Agreement.
- A. A qualified property owner may participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program through the execution of an energize NY finance agreement made by and between the Qualified Property Owner and EIC, acting on behalf of the County (the "Energize NY Finance Agreement).
- B. Upon execution of the energize NY finance agreement, the qualified property owner shall be eligible to receive funds from EIC acting on behalf of the County, for the acquisition, construction, and installation of qualifying renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvements; provided the requirements of § 50-8 of this chapter have been met.
- C. The Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement shall include the terms and conditions of repayment set forth under § 50-9 of this chapter.
- § 50-8. Energy audit, renewable energy system feasibility study.
- A. No funds shall be made available for Energy Efficiency Improvements unless determined to be appropriate through an Energy Audit, as defined in § 50-3.
- B. No funds shall be made available for a Renewable Energy System unless determined to be feasible through a renewable energy system feasibility study as defined in § 50-3.
- C. The cost of such Energy Audit and/or Renewable Energy System Feasibility Study shall be borne solely by the property owner but may be included in the financed amount if the work is approved.
- § 50-9. Terms and conditions of repayment.

The Energize <u>NY</u> Finance Agreement between the Qualified Property Owner and EIC acting on behalf of the County, shall set forth the terms and conditions of repayment in accordance with the following:

A. The principal amount of the funds paid to the Qualified Property Owner hereunder, together with the interest thereon, shall be paid by the property owner as a charge on their real property tax bill and shall be levied and collected at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes, provided that such charge shall be separately listed on the tax bill. The County shall make payment to EIC or its designee in the amount of all such separately listed charges within 30 days of the date the payment is due to be made to the County [real property tax due date].

- B. The term of such repayment shall be determined at the time the Energize NY Finance Agreement is executed by the property owner and EIC, provided that in no case shall the term exceed the weighted average of the useful life of the systems and improvements as determined by EIC acting on behalf of the County.
- C. The rate of interest for the charge shall be fixed by EIC acting on behalf of the County at the time the Energize NY Finance Agreement is executed by the property owner and EIC.
- D. The charge shall constitute a lien upon the real property benefited by the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program <u>as set forth in Article 5-L of the General Municipal Law</u> and shall run with the land. A transferee of title to the benefited real property shall be required to pay any future installments, including interest thereon.

§ 50-10. Verification and report.

- A. EIC shall be responsible for verifying and reporting to the County on the installation and performance of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements financed by such Program.
- B. The County shall verify and report on the installation and performance of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements financed by the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program in such form and manner as the Authority may establish.

Section 2 This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Broome County Charter and Code, the County Legislature shall be the governing body of the County and shall be the legislative, appropriating and policy-determining body of the County, and

WHEREAS, said duties include a fiduciary responsibility to the taxpayers of Broome County that proper fiscal oversight is administered and that tax dollars are spent wisely and within the parameters of the annual County Budget, and

WHEREAS, the Broome County Charter and Code requires that the Director of the Office of Management and Budget provide the County Legislature with an annual statement of financial condition, and

WHEREAS, the Comptroller of the State of New York issued an audit of Broome County's financial condition and cited "that more financial information would provide more opportunity for oversight", and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature deems that accurate, regular and complete up-to-date financial information is critical in its role of providing fiscal oversight and in determining the County's financial condition, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law Intro. No. 2 of 2018, entitled: "A Local Law Amending Sections C502 and A503 of the Broome County Charter and Code Regarding the Office of Management and

Budget," be and the same hereby is adopted and approved in accordance with the Broome County Charter and Code and all the applicable statutes and laws pertaining thereto.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 2 of 2018 A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTIONS C502 AND A503 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE REGARDING THE OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Broome as follows: **SECTION 1**. Section C502 of the Broome County Charter is amended as follows: § C502. Powers and duties.

The Director of Management and Budget shall:

- (A) Be the chief fiscal officer of the County and have charge of the administration of all its financial affairs.
- (B) Collect, receive, have custody of, deposit, invest and disburse all fees, revenues and other funds of the County or for which the County is responsible.
- (C) Submit to the County Legislature annually on or before the first day of April, and at such other times as such Legislature may require, a complete financial statement containing a general balance sheet for the County. In addition to the annual requirement of this section, the Director shall also submit reports required under §A503 of Article V of the Administrative Code.
- (D) Audit and certify for payment all lawful claims or charges against the County or against funds for which the County is responsible.
- (E) Annually, and at such times as he may deem appropriate, and at such other times as directed by the County Executive or County Legislature, audit the financial records and accounts of all officers and employees charged with any duty relating to County funds or funds for which the County is responsible.
- (F) Procure statements from all depositaries of County funds and funds for which the County is responsible and reconcile such statements with the County accounts
- (G) Submit to the County Legislature and County Executive reports in such form and detail and at such time as may be prescribed by the County Legislature or County Executive.
- (H) Perform such other and related duties as shall be required or delegated to him by the County Executive or County Legislature.

SECTION 2. Section A503 of the Broome County Administrative Code is amended as follows:

§ A503. Statement of financial condition.

- (A) In addition to the annual report required by § C502(C) of Article V of the Charter, the Director of Management and Budget shall <u>provide a</u> <u>quarterly report on or before the first day of January, April, July, and October,</u> and at such other times as the County Executive or the County Legislature may by resolution direct, submit to the County Executive, the Comptroller and the County Legislature a statement of the financial condition of the County.
- (B) In addition to the foregoing, the statement of financial condition shall:
 - (1) Set forth all revenues received by the County.
 - (2) Set forth for each appropriation account the amount appropriated, the amount encumbered but remaining unexpended, the aggregate expenditures and the unencumbered balance.

- (3) Set forth the actual amount of current unassigned fund balance based on the prior quarter's revenues and expenditures.
- (4) Set forth a list of all open Capital Projects, including the total of each project, the outstanding expenditures, liabilities and available appropriations.
- (5) Set forth a list of all County Trust Accounts, including prior quarter's balance, deposits made into, expenditures from, and end of month balance for each account.
- (6) Set forth an asset list detailing the disposal, and addition of assets, including vehicles and equipment, over the prior quarter.
- (7) Set forth a County personnel list detailing the number of County employees, including full-time, part-time, and temporary, and the net change from the prior guarter.
- (8) Upon receipt of said reports, the County Legislature shall post them in a conspicuous location on the official Broome County website in order for the information to be accessible to the general public.
- (9) [(3)] Include such other information as the County Executive may order or the County Legislature by resolution may direct.

SECTION 3. Effective Date: This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
