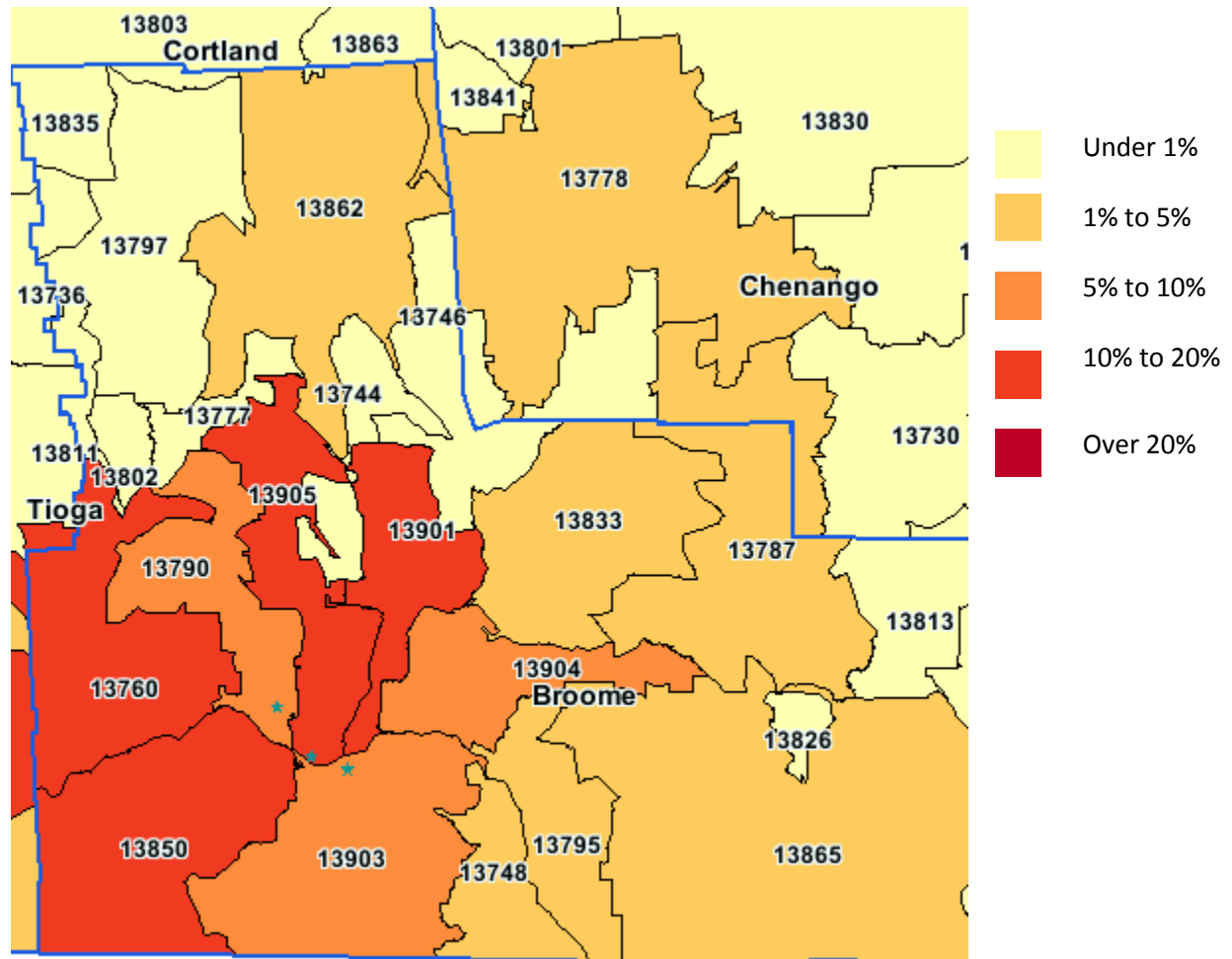

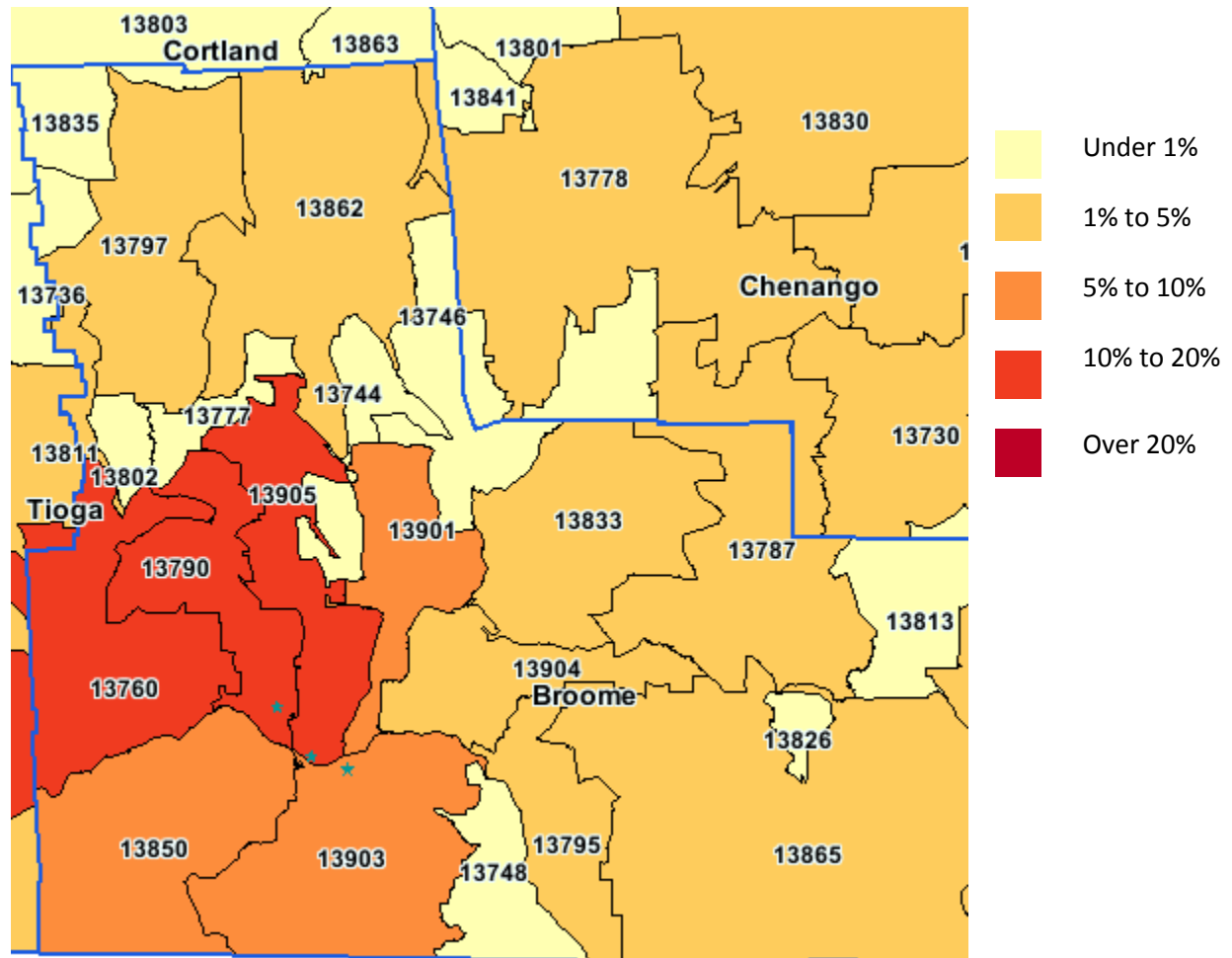

G 3. Our Lady of Lourdes Memorial Hospital, Percent Hospital Discharges by Zip Code, 2008-2009



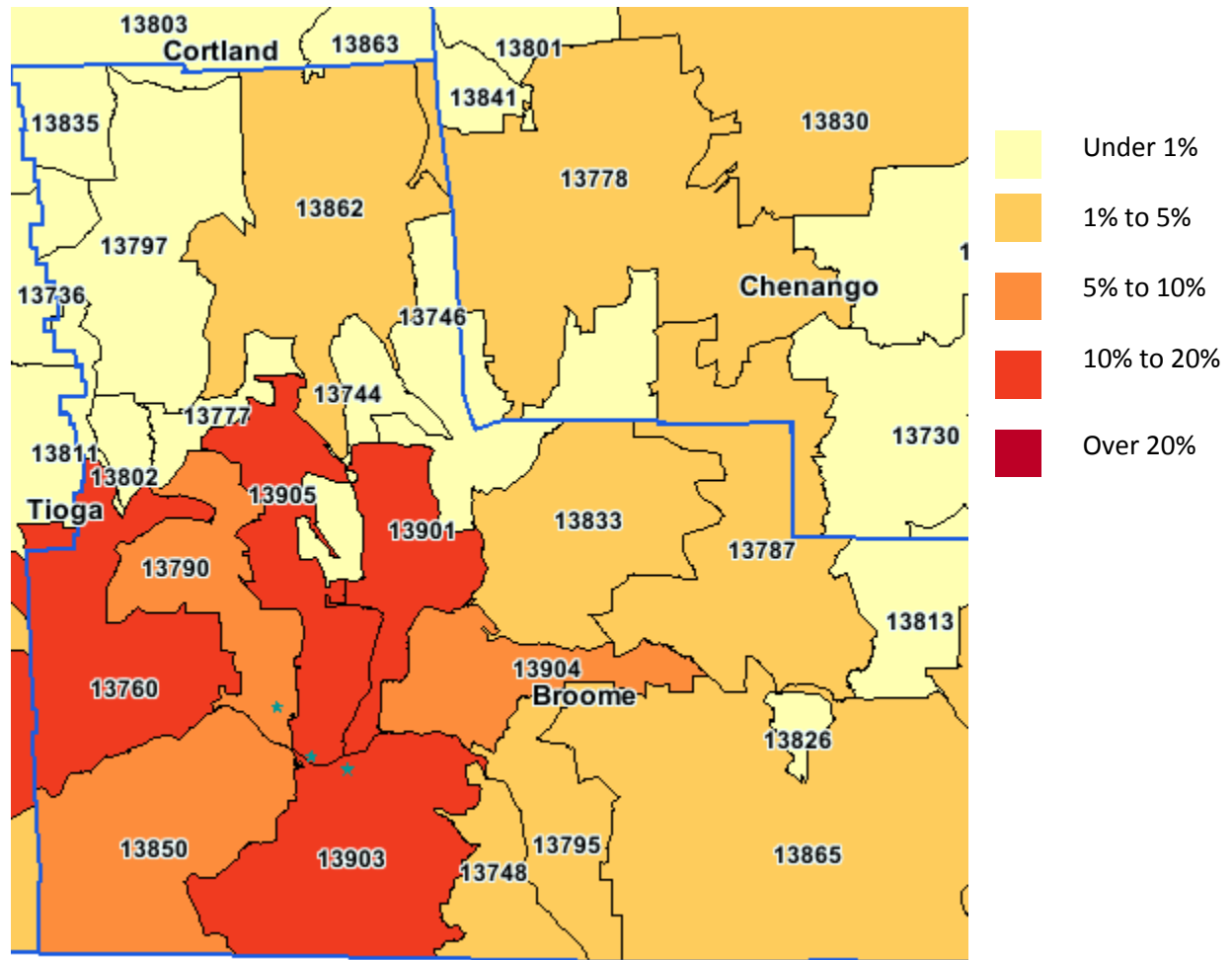

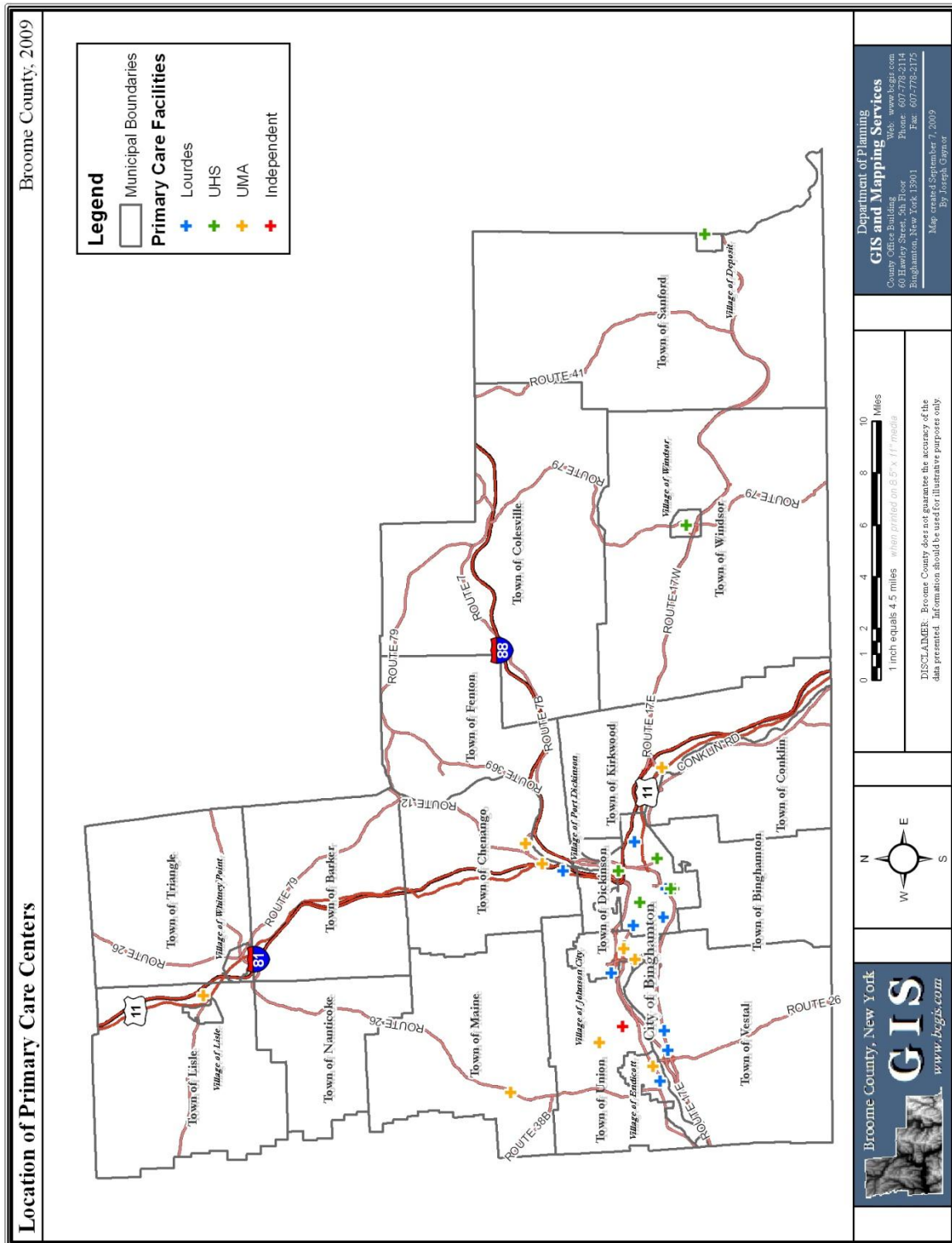

G 7. Location of Primary Care Centers in Broome County, New York, 2009



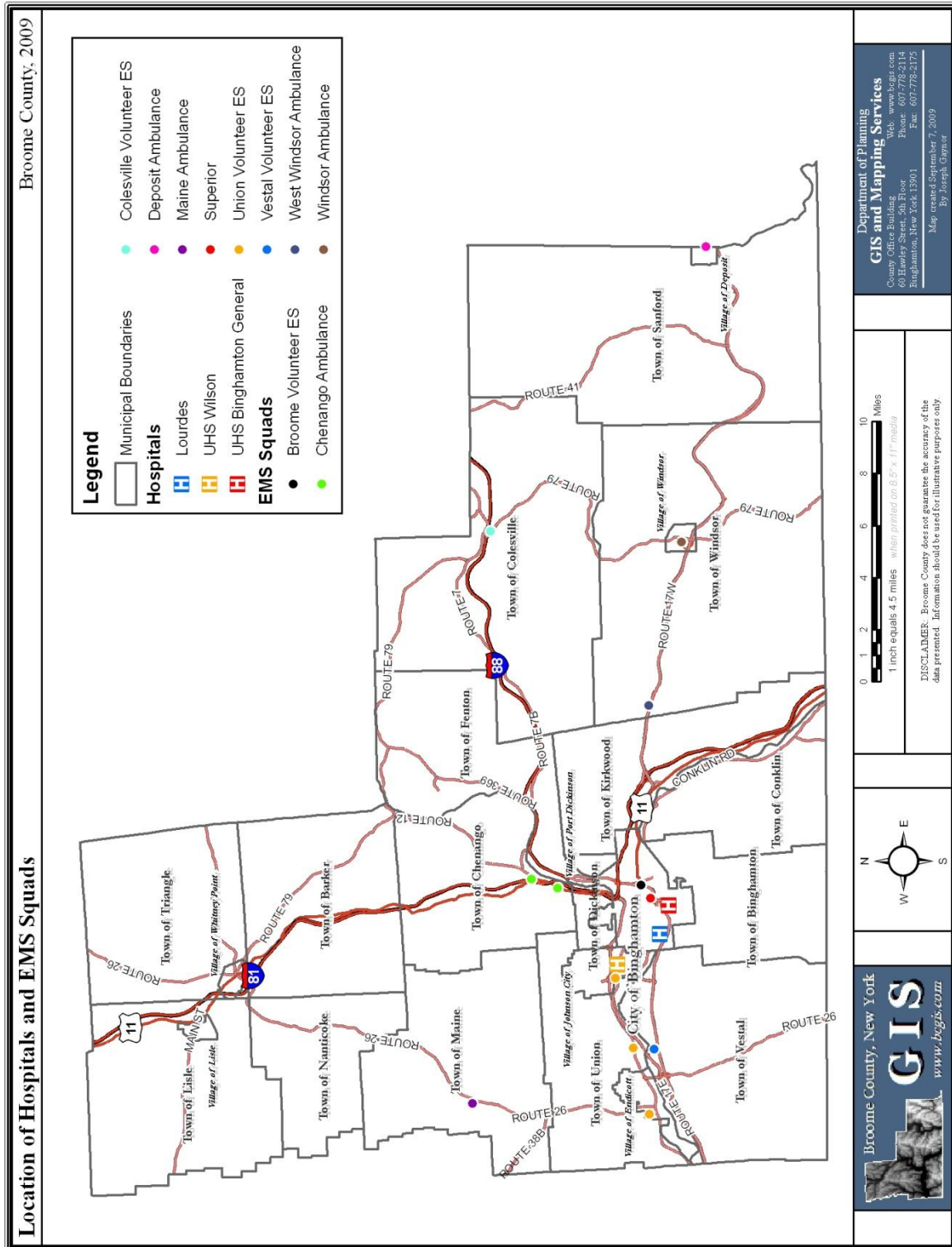

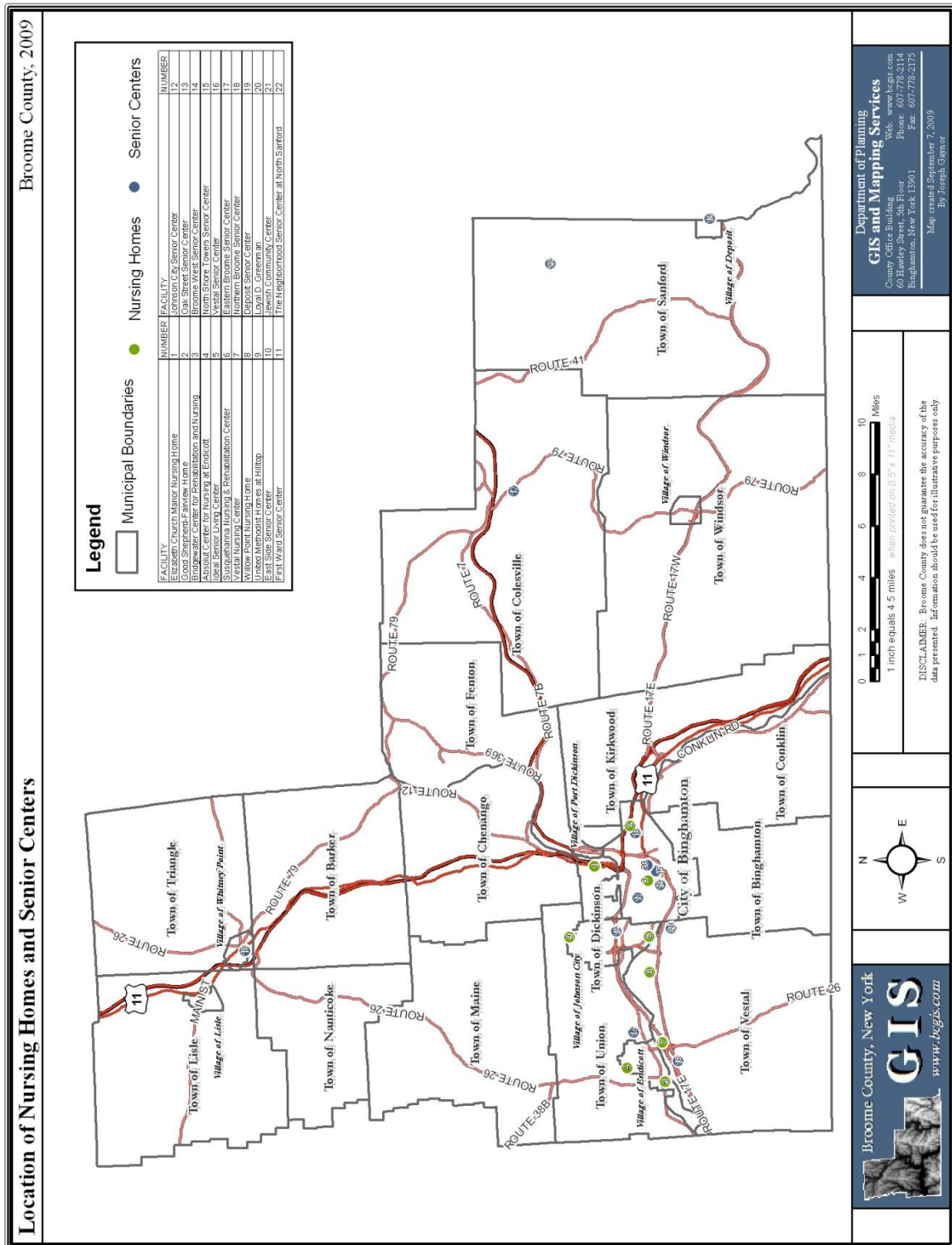

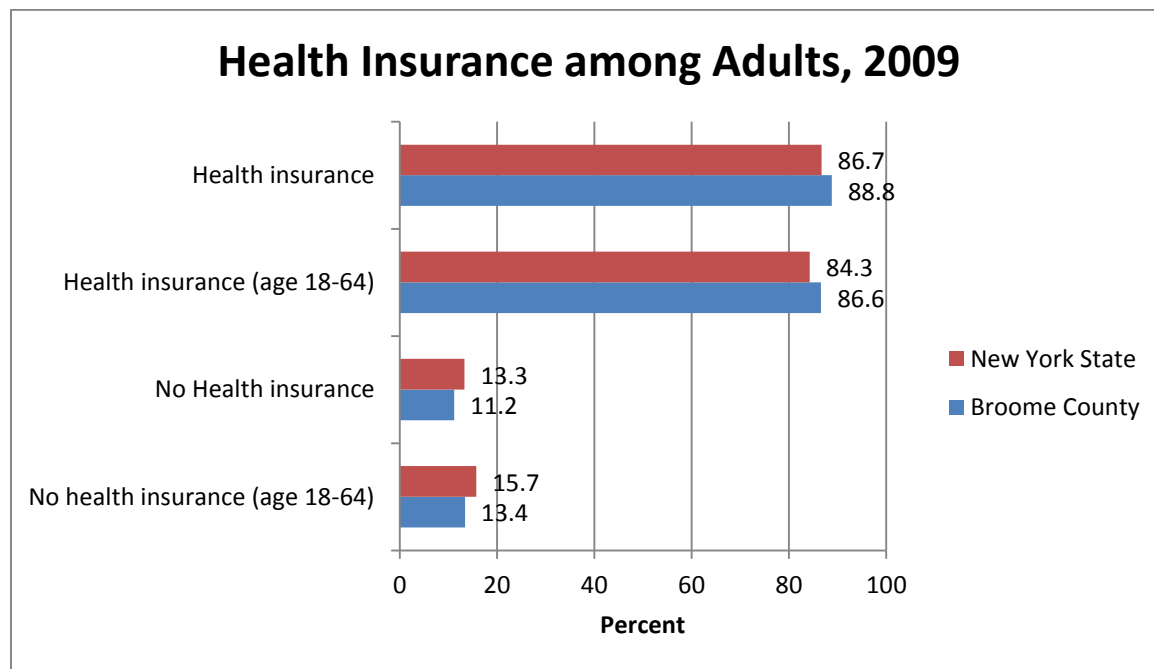

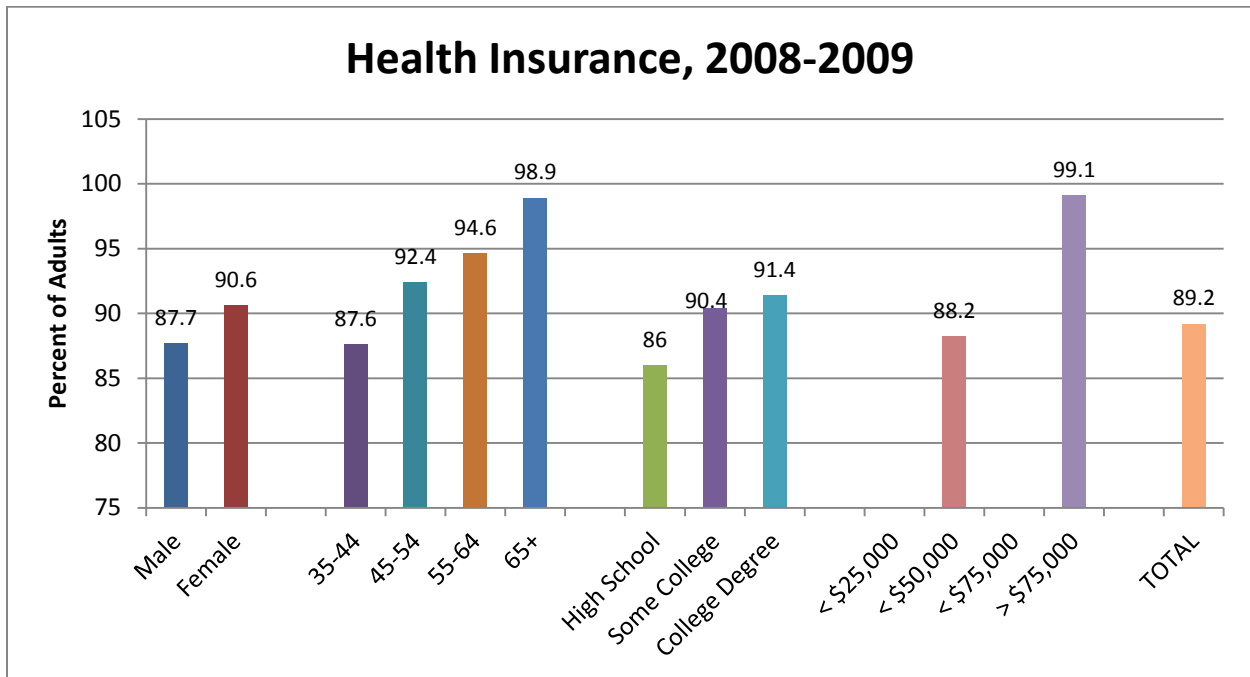

G 20. Health Insurance among Adults [Age-Adjusted], Broome County, NYS, 2009



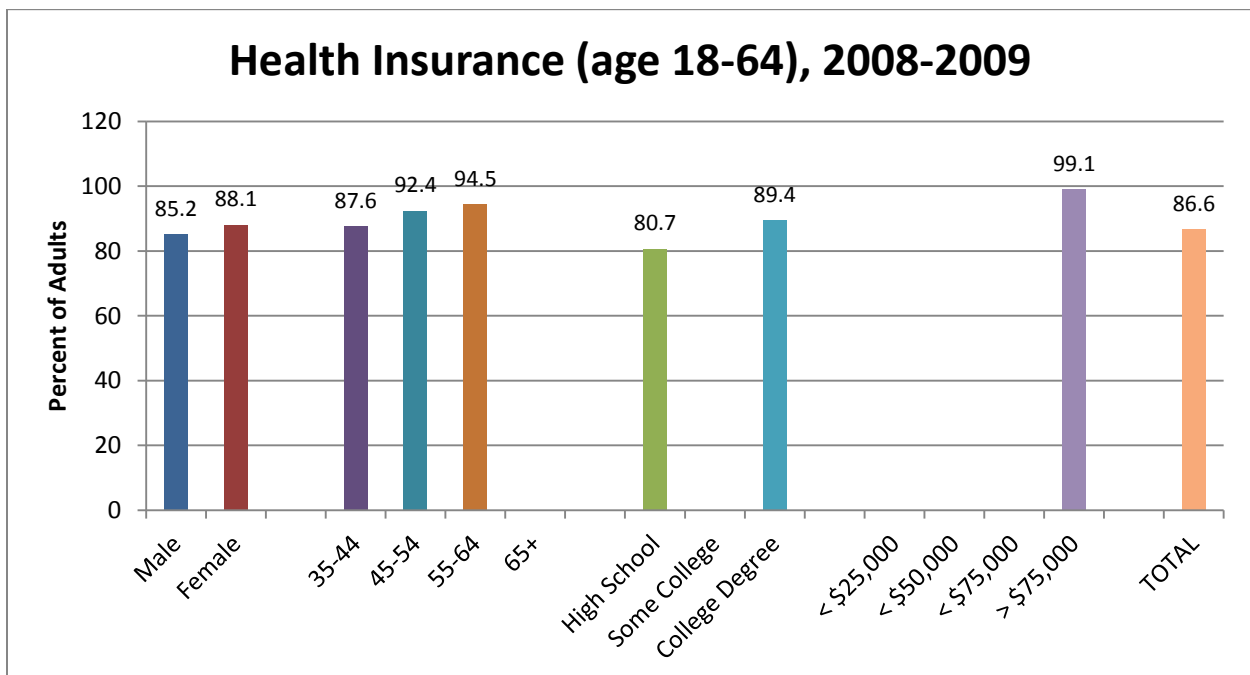

G 21. Health Insurance among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



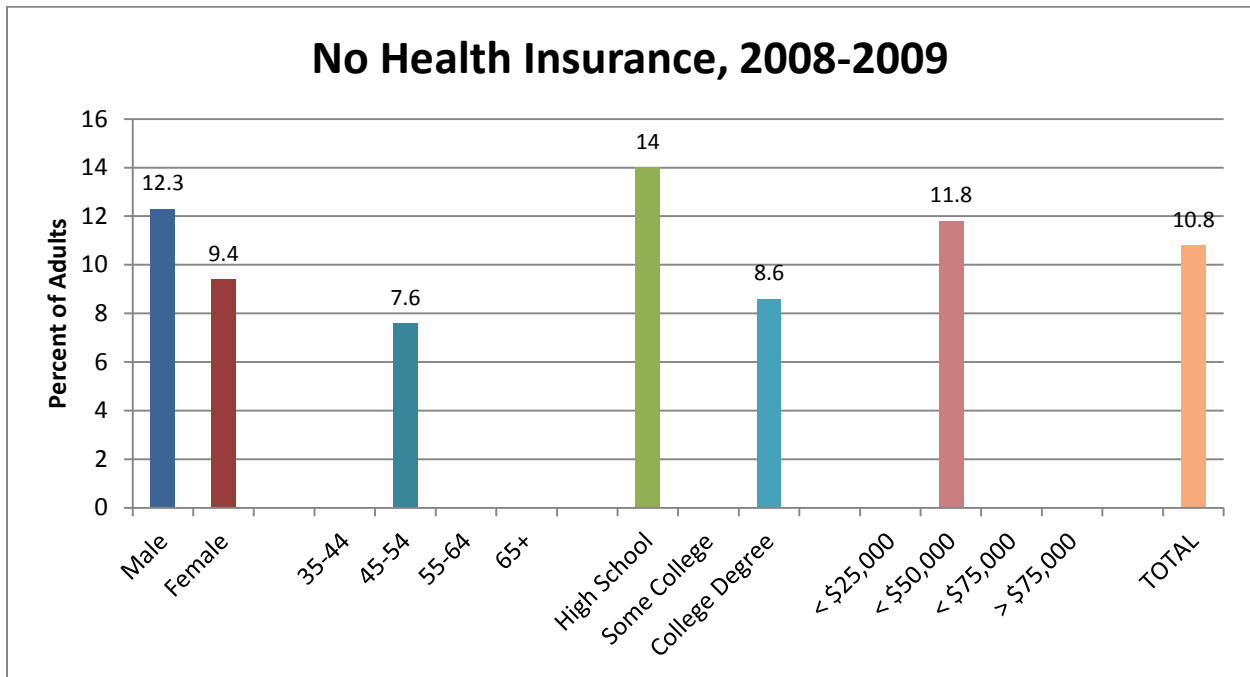

G 22. Health Insurance among Adults Aged 18-64, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



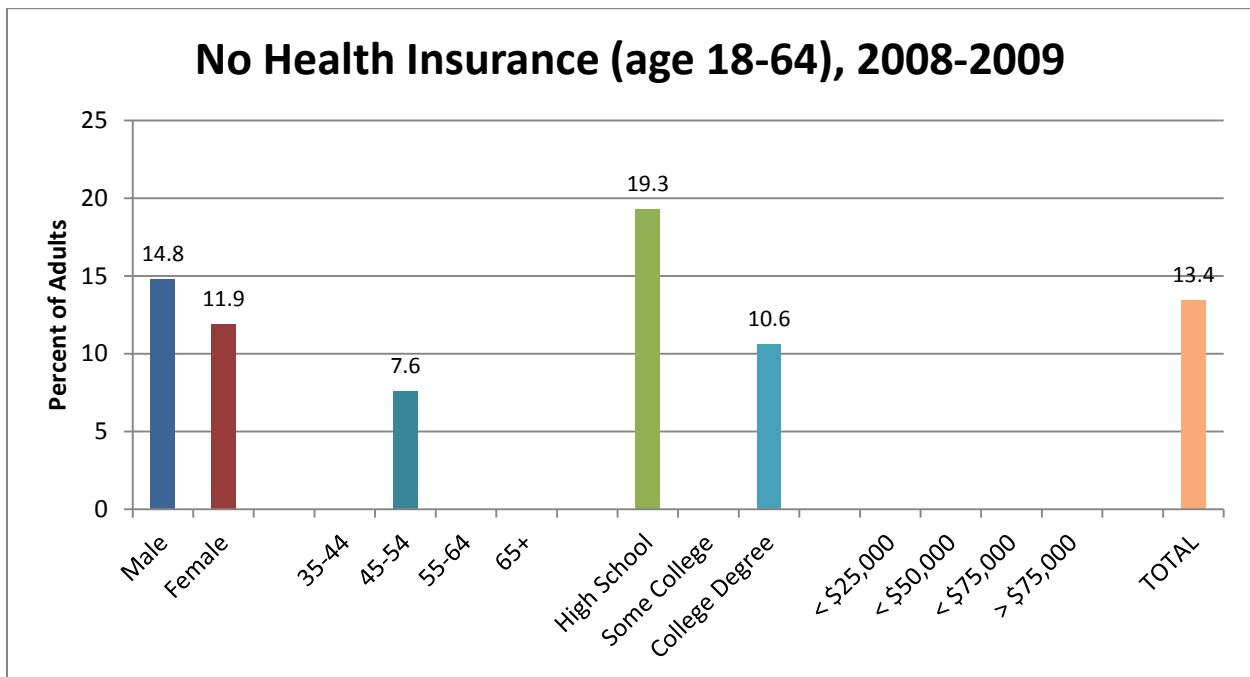

G 23. No Health Insurance among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



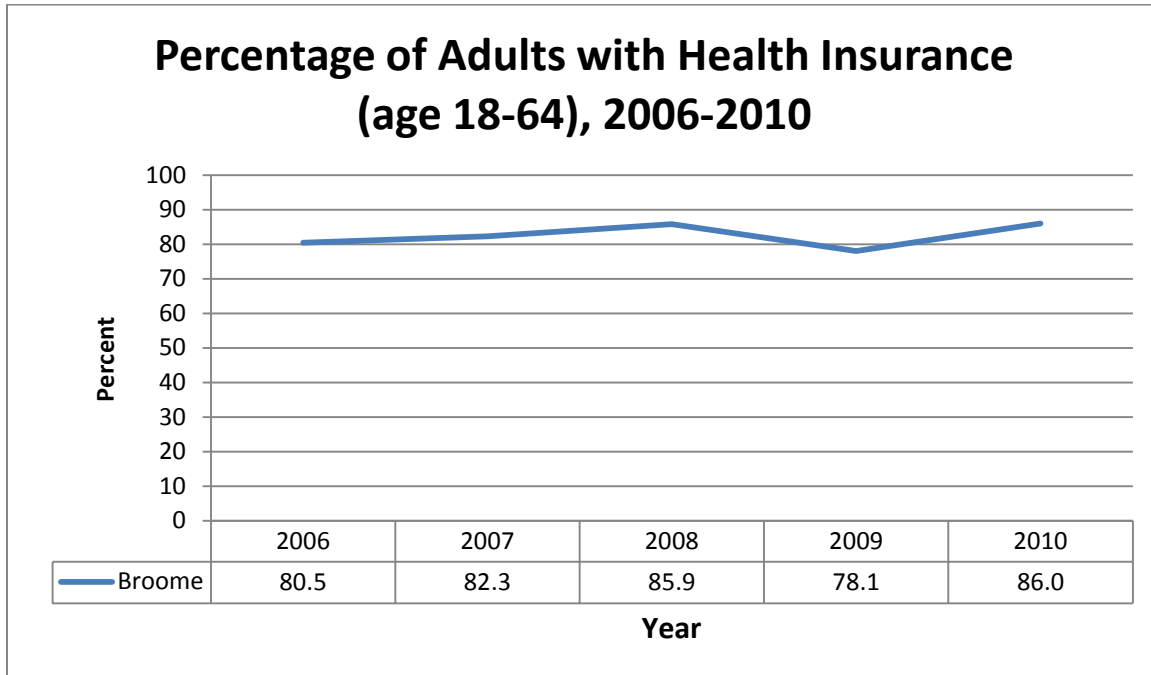

G 24. No Health Insurance among Adults Age 18 to 64, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



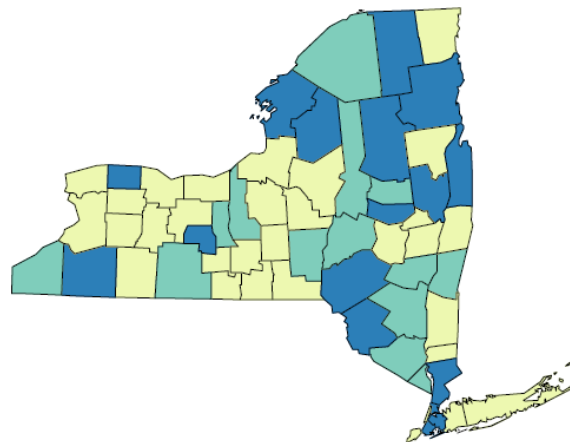

G 26. Percentage of Adults (age 18-64) with Health Insurance, 2010

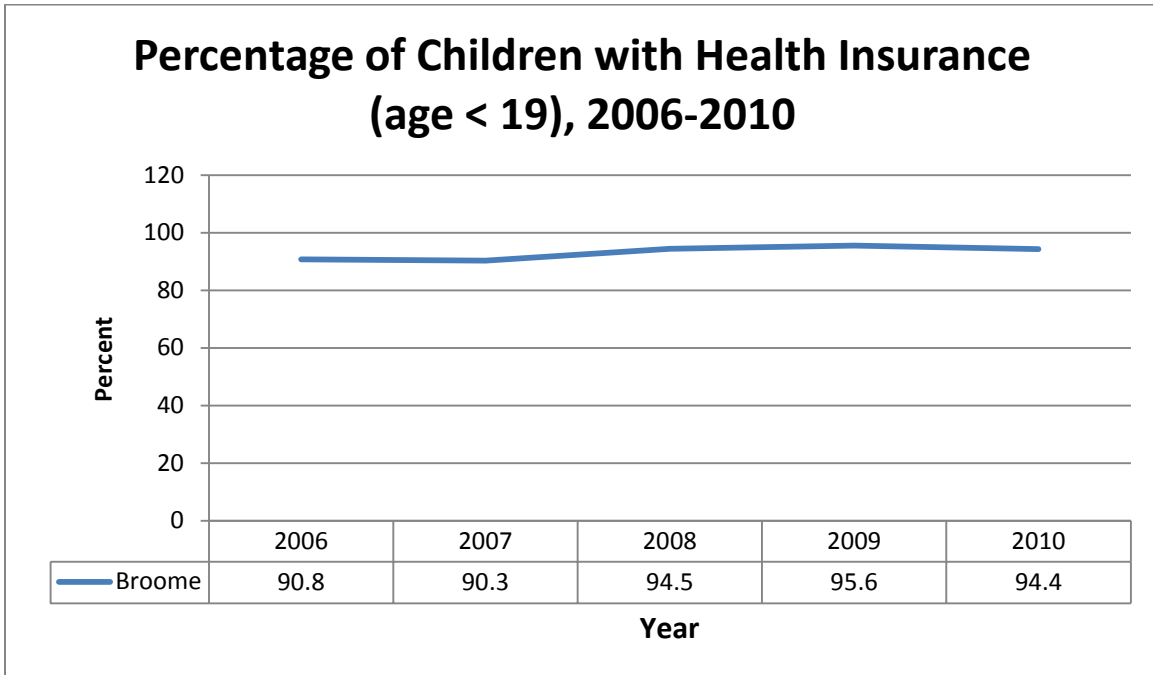

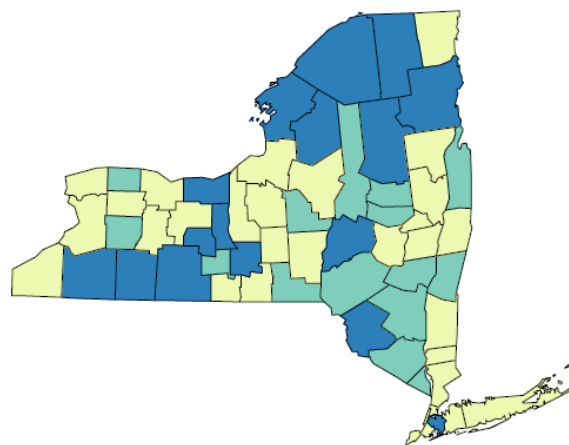

G 27. Percentage of Children with Health Insurance (age < 19 years), Broome County (single year), 2006-2010 [Crude Rate]

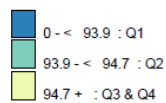

G 28. Percentage of Children < 19 Years with Health Insurance, 2010



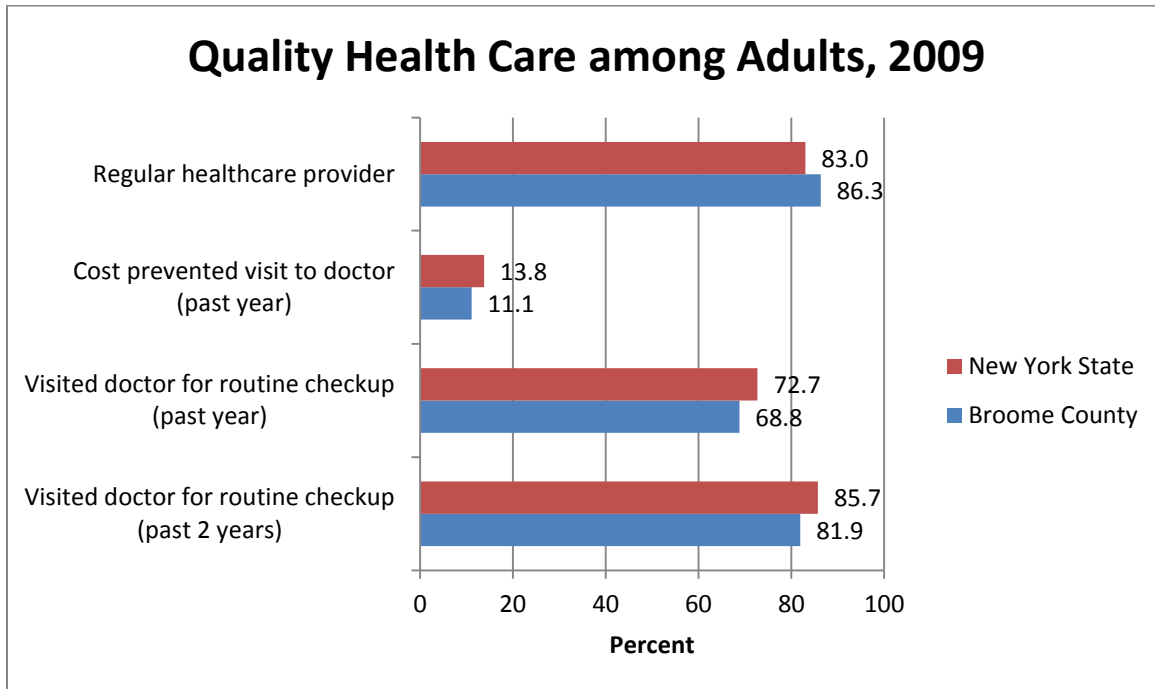

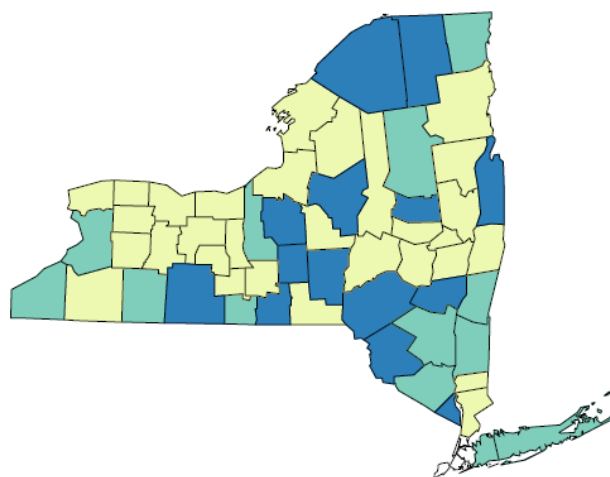

G 30. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults who did not Receive Medical Care Because of the Cost, 2008-2009

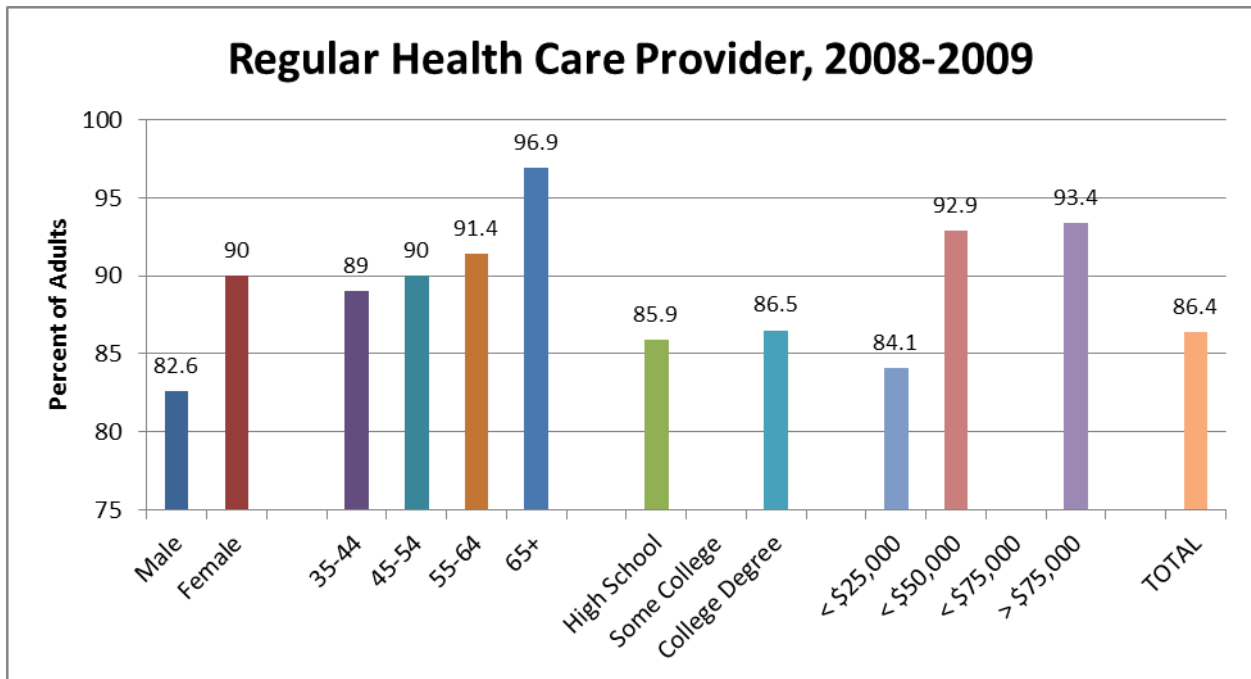

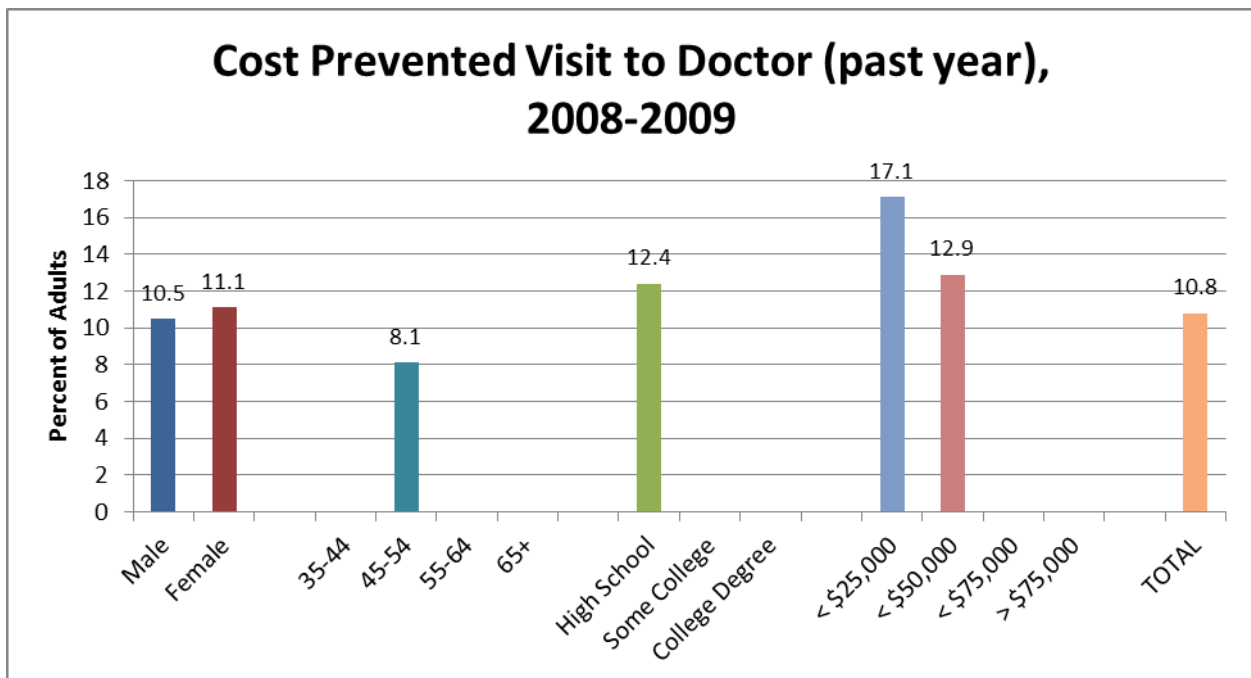

G 31. Adults with Regular Health Care Provider, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



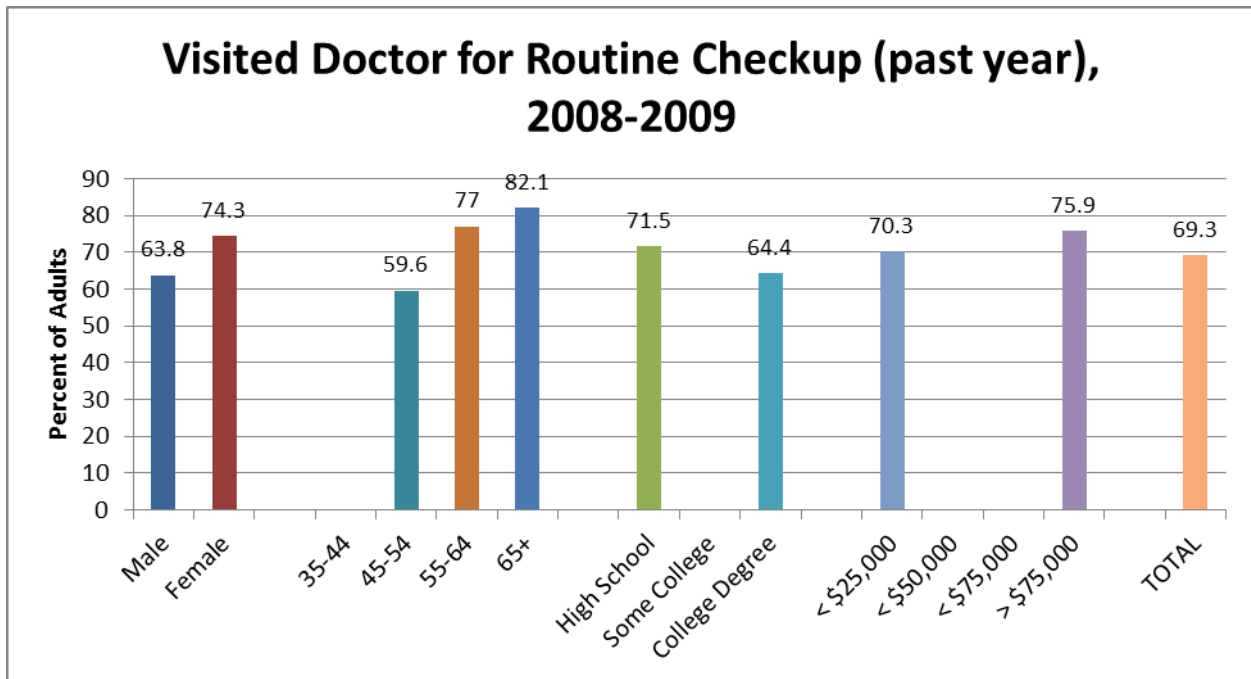

G 32. Cost Prevented Visit to Doctor within the Past Year among Adults, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



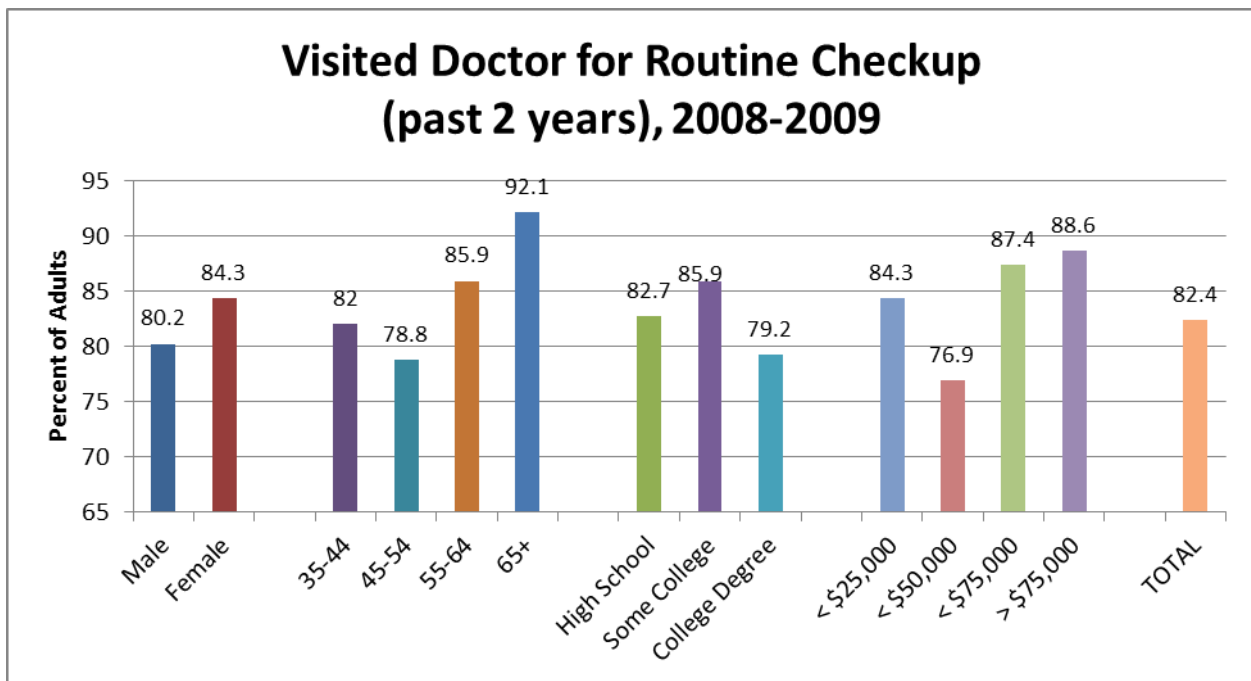

G 33. Visited a Doctor for Routine Checkup within the Past Year, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009



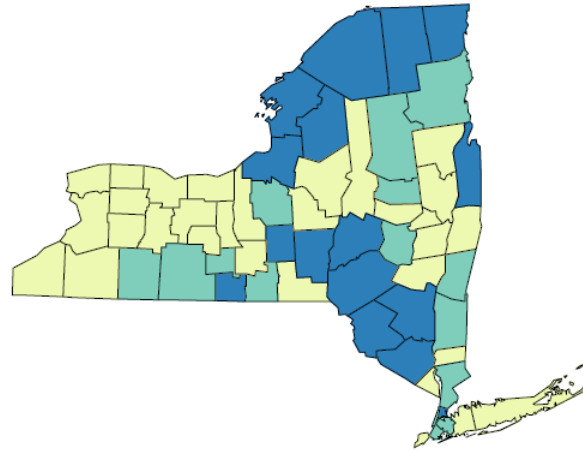

G 34. Visited a Doctor for Routine Checkup within Past Two Years, Broome County, NY, 2008-2009

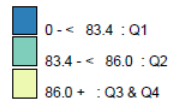

G 35. Age-adjusted Percentage of Adults with Regular Health Care Provider, 2008-2009



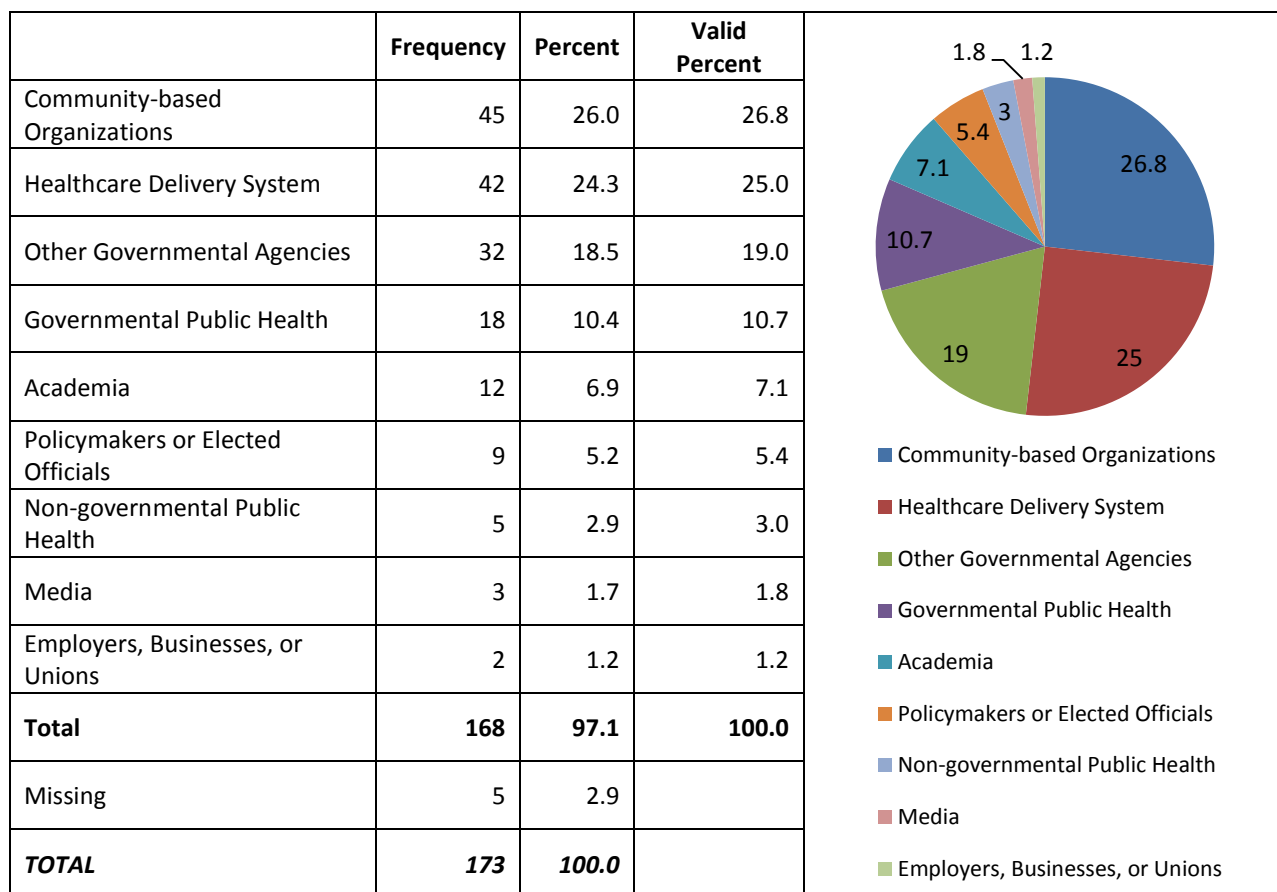

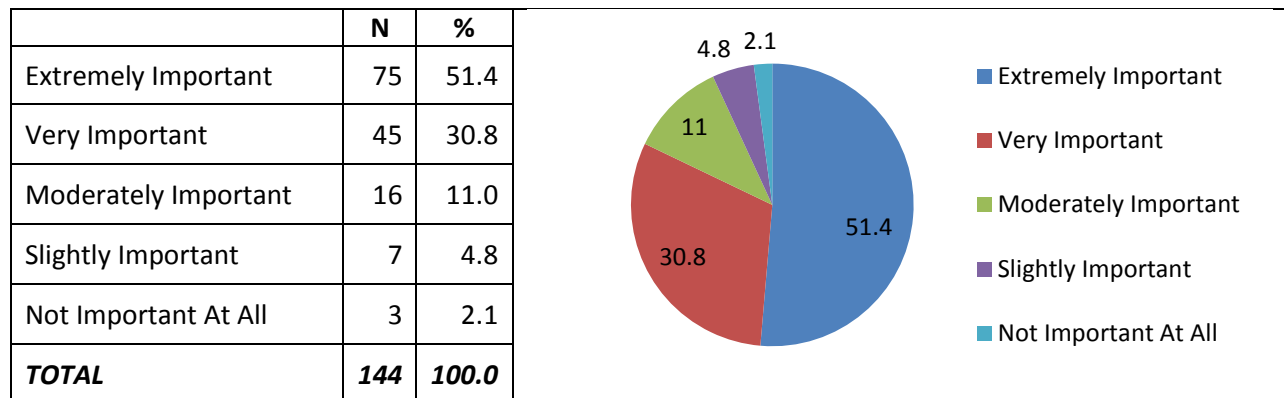

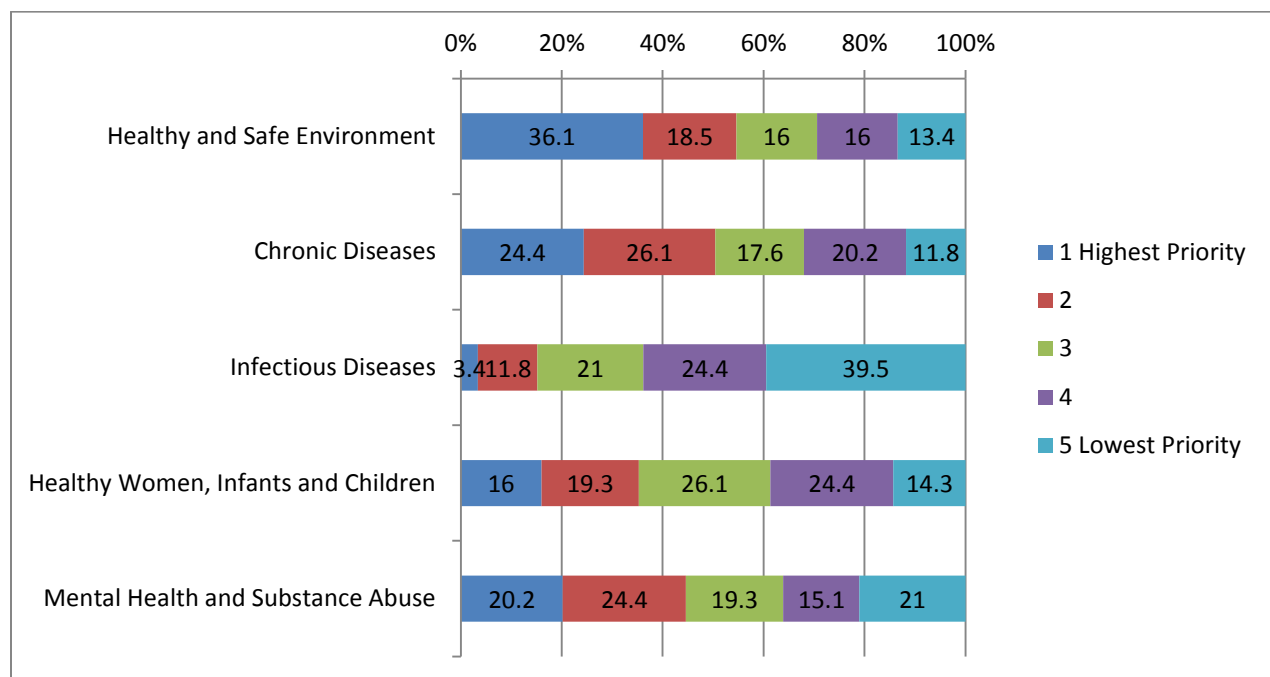

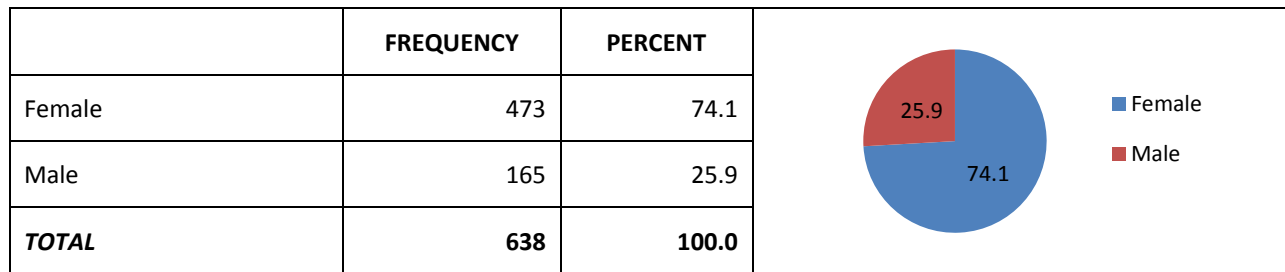

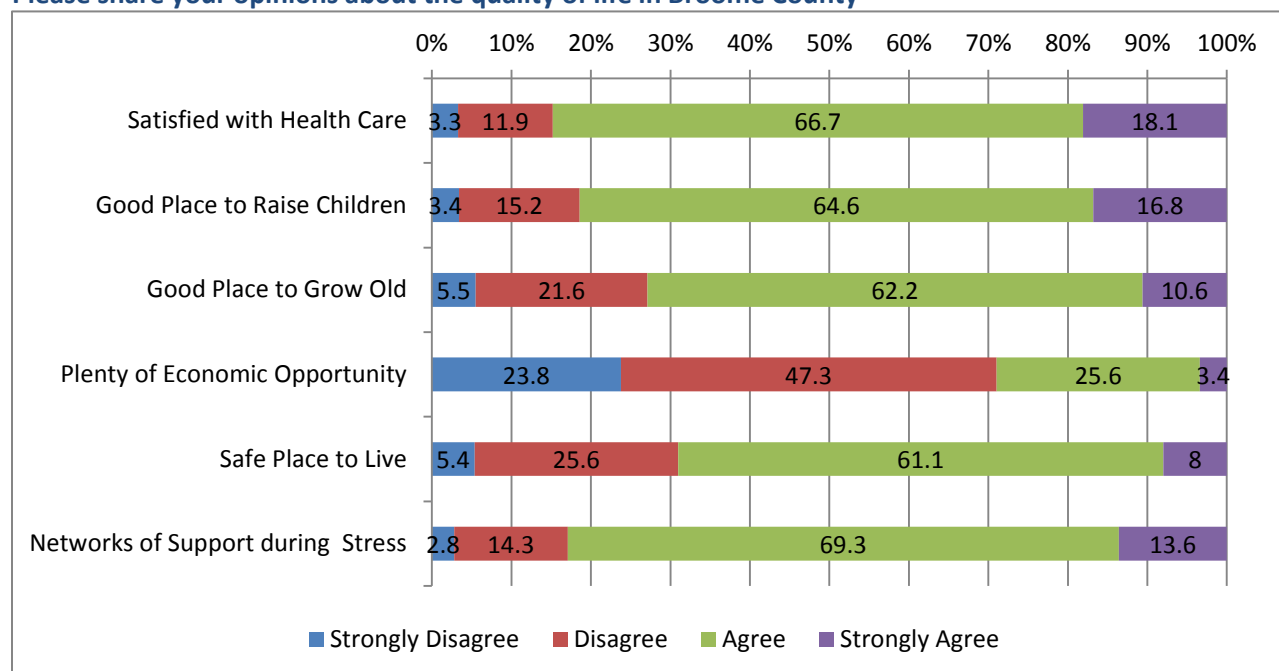


G 60. In the past year, have you needed medical, dental, or mental healthcare services but you were not able to receive the care you needed?

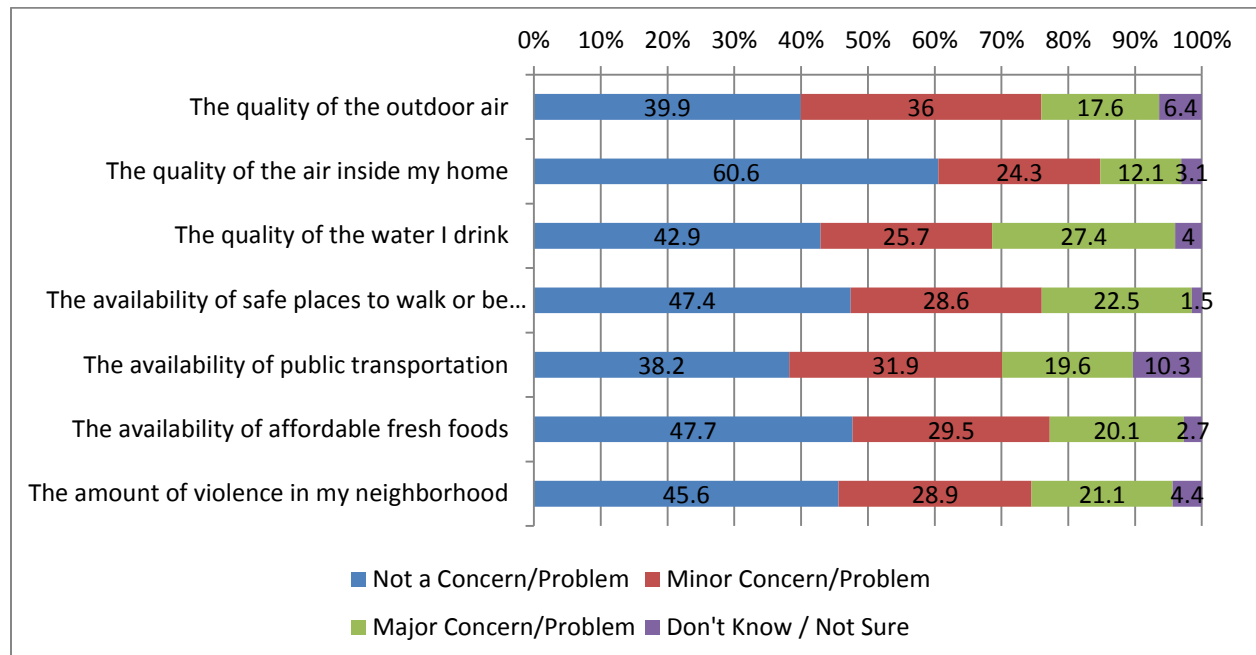

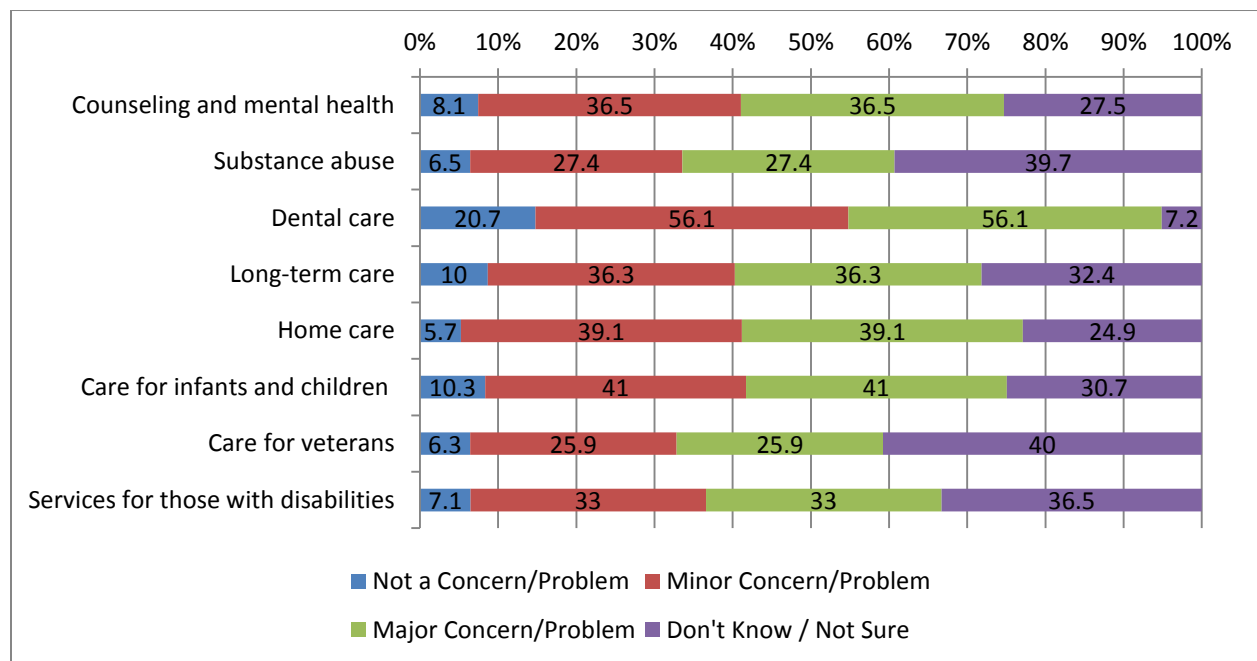

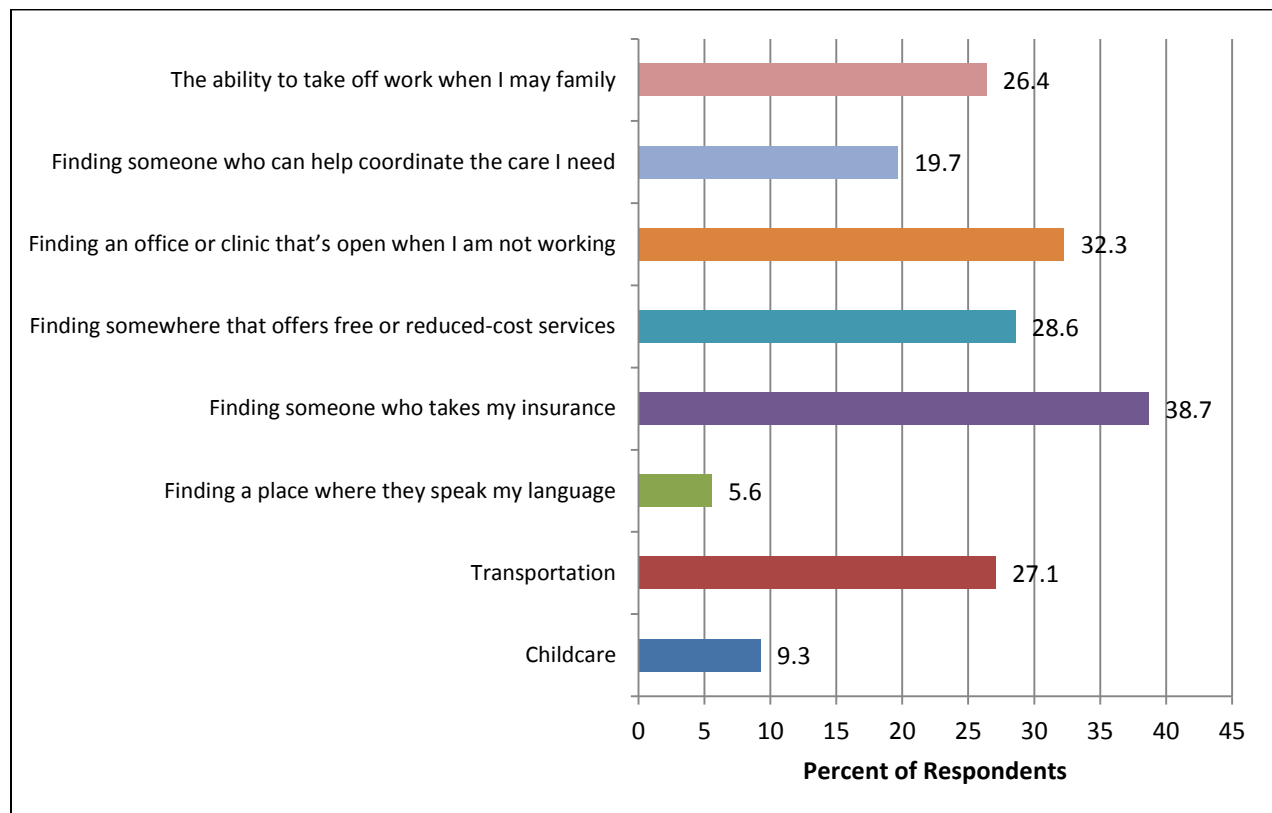
