WHEREAS, any potential contractor seeking to perform lead hazard Rehabilitation/remediation work under the HUD Lead Hazard Reduction Grant may apply with the Health Department, but it is the potential contractor's responsibility to acquire the requisite licenses, trainings, and certifications; and upon providing proper documentation, the potential contractor will be added to the queue of pre-approved contractors, and

WHEREAS, for each project identified, one of the pre-approved contractors will be selected in sequence to perform the work, and
