## BROOME COUNTY LEGISLATURE SPECIAL SESSION MONDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 1998

The Legislature convened at $4: 08 \mathrm{pm}$ with a call to order by the Chair, Daniel A. Schofield. The Clerk, Louis P. Augostini, read the fire exit announcement and called the Attendance Roll, Present-17, Absent-2 (Brunza, Pasquale).

Mr. Schofield indicated that the Legislature would start with a review of the Finance Committee Report, to be followed by consideration of motions from individuals.
